



**Normal Range Safety Regulations for this 50m range apply. However these additional regulations also apply when using the Running Boar target.**

- 1** The Firing Point (FP) to be used is position 3 only. Dry firing may be carried out on FPs 2 and 4 whilst the moving target is being used only if it does not disturb the actual firer. RCO is to stand at FP 3.
- 2** The RCO may also be the controller of the running boar activation switch however his primary role is to be responsible for safety on the range.
- 3** The RCO must be extra vigilant to ensure that the firer does not release a shot beyond the target run area and be aware that there is a danger of accidental release of shot by fingers when closing the bolt.
- 4** The Running Boar target exposure gap at the firing distance of 50m must be set at 10m. This is marked by a white vertical line at either end of the sleepers. The exposure gap at the firing distance of 25m is to be set at 5m. This is also marked on the sleepers.
- 5** When firing from 25m you must stand at the centre of the range on a line with FP 3 and be supervised by an RCO. Firing must only take place at 25m and 50m. Position is standing only.
- 6** In order to allow all members to shoot, the normal NMPC course of fire is shorter than customary ISSF rules state (4+30). Unless otherwise agreed by firers on the day the NMPC course of fire is 2+10 i.e. two (2) shots sighting and ten (10) shots to count. Members are allowed to fire fewer shots if they wish. Firers must only shoot one shot per exposure of the target.
- 7** When the firer takes up his stance at the FP he may get into position and practice aiming the rifle with the breech open. When he has finished preparing he is to indicate to the RCO that he is ready to load. The RCO's commands will be "LOAD AND MAKE READY". The firer will attach the magazine of rounds, load a tubular magazine, or may load a single round if preferred, close the breech and stand at the 'ready' position. The firer will call "READY" only before each sighter and the first shot to count (after the first shot to count the series of fire will continue automatically without further input from the firer). Although the British Sporting Rifle Club encourages firers to load single rounds the use of magazines is quite acceptable. However the RCO must take greater care when supervising self-loading rifles.
- 8** The 'ready' position must **not** be with the rifle in the pointing up angled position as is detailed in ISSF Rules. On this range the 'ready' position must be with the rifle parallel to the ground at a level between waist and shoulder. The heel of the rifle should be away from the shoulder when the rifle is in the 'ready' position and the trigger finger should be outside of the trigger guard.
- 9** Firers must not move the rifle until the target appears. After it has disappeared again the firer is to chamber a further round and stand once more in the 'ready' position. The operator will continue to repeat the target movement until the course of fire has been completed.
- 10** At the end of the series the RCO will say "END OF SERIES – UNLOAD AND SHOW CLEAR".
- 11** When Running Boar shooting has finished the range must be reinstated to normal and the running boar target must be removed from the carriage and placed in the Firing Point range building. The generator must be put in the container.
